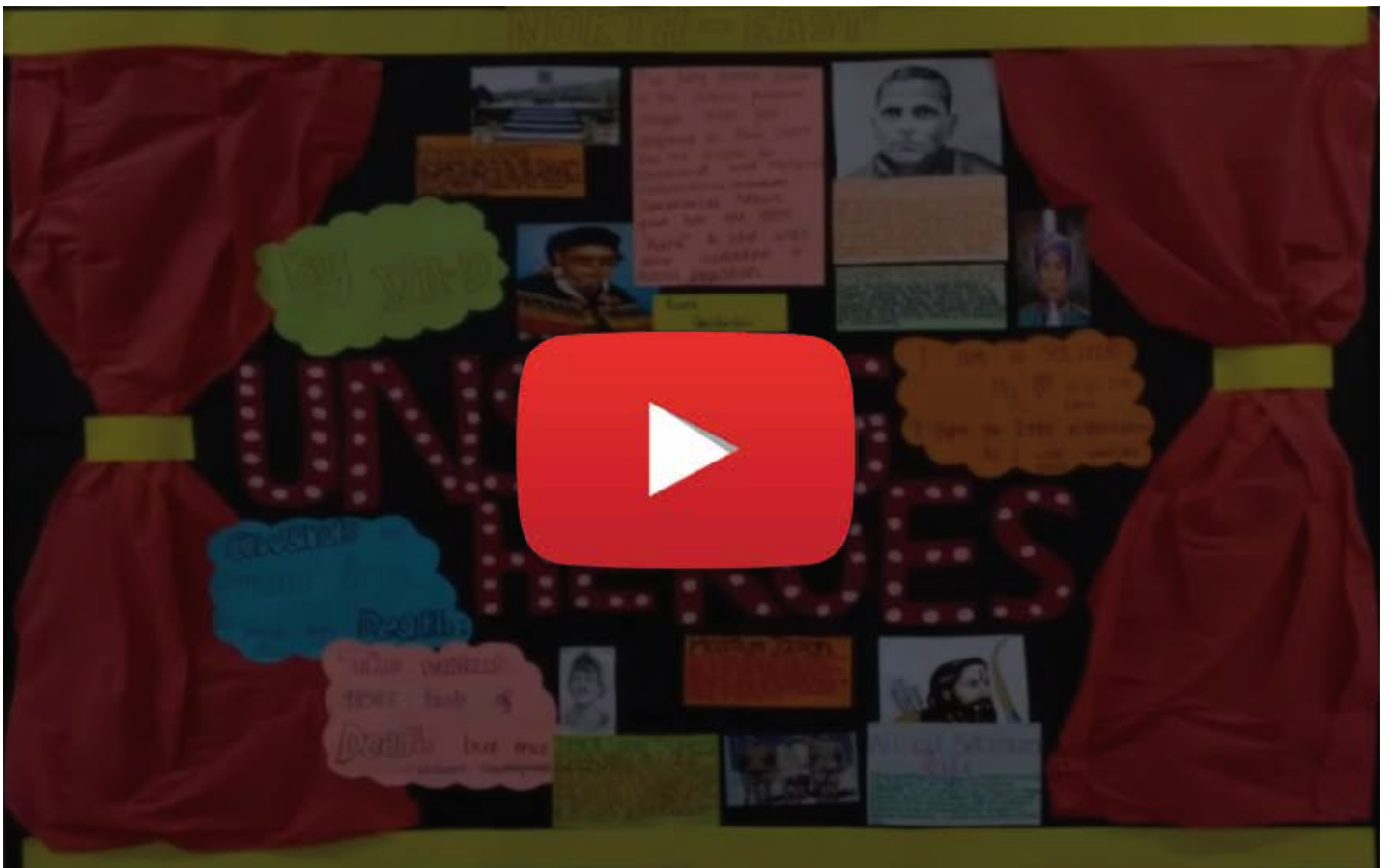
Desh Apnayen salutes all these icons of courage, determination and focus.

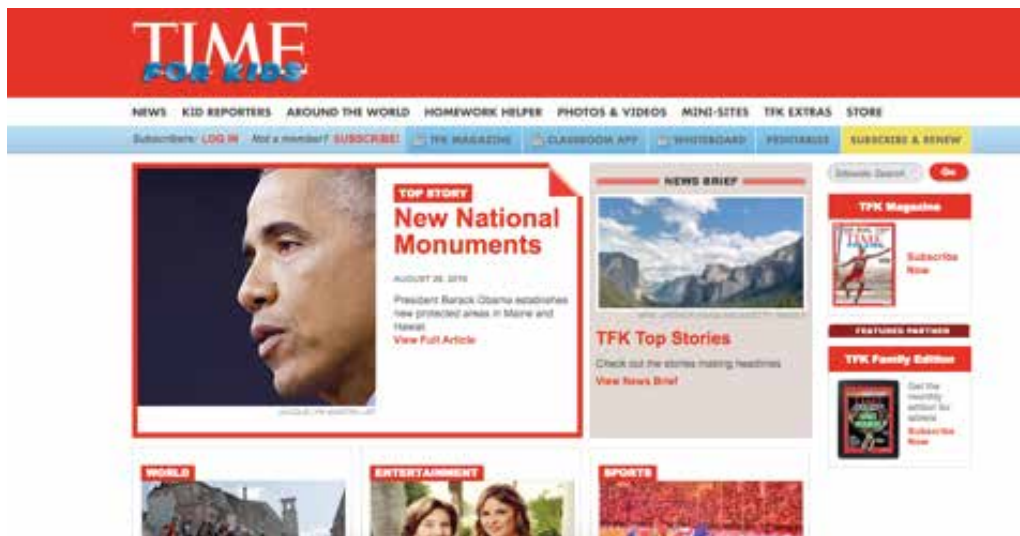
Our Monthly Favourites

App of the month

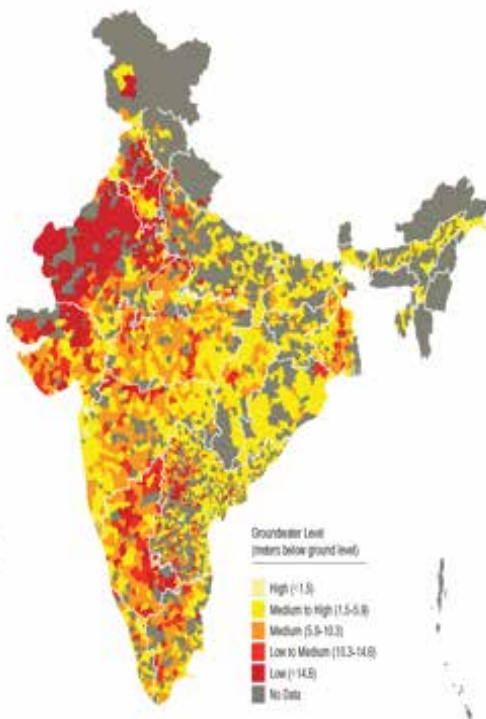
Our app of the month is Pokemon Go, the game that has taken the world by storm. Pokémon Go is a free-to-play, location-based reality game developed by Niantic for iOS and Android devices. In the game, players use a mobile device's GPS capability to locate, capture, battle, and train virtual creatures, called Pokémon, who appear on the screen as if they were in the same real-world location as the player. Pokémon Go was released to mixed reviews but despite such reviews, it quickly became a global phenomenon and was one of the most used mobile apps, having been downloaded by more than 130 million people worldwide.

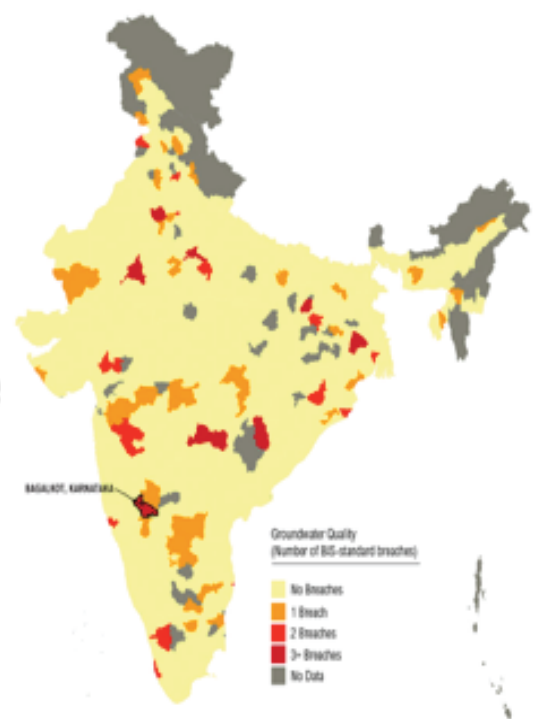
